URMULE registrations to date 2014 – hops

Pristine (boscalid + pyraclostrobin) – downy and powdery mildew
Agri-mek (abamectin) – mites [pending final label]
Vivando (metrafenone) – powdery mildew [pending final label]

Emergency use registrations 2014 – hops

None

Active URMULE projects underway – hops

Ranman (cyazofamid) – downy mildew
Kanemite (acequinocyl) – mites
Success/ Entrust (spinosad) – loopers
Presidio (fluopicolide) – downy mildew
Aim (carfentrazone) – weeds
Alion (indaziflam) - weeds
Fulfill (pymetrozine) – aphids
Purespray Green 13E (mineral oil) – mites, powdery mildew
Pyganic (pyrethrins) – aphids, leafhoppers
Select/Centurion (clethodim) – grassy weeds

Current Minor Use Priorities – hops

- See attached table provided for review
- The role of commodity organizations in collaboration with crop specialists and researchers is to annually prioritize your key minor use pests and potential solutions.
- These priorities are then added to the provincial minor use priority list for all commodities and then collated by AAFC-PMC into a national minor use priority list.
- Priorities are compared to other provinces and in some cases the US priorities at IR-4.
- Top priorities chosen for AAFC-PMC work at the national minor use priority-setting meeting held in Ottawa each year.
- Remaining priorities deferred or submitted by province resources permitting

Current & On-going Minor Use Issues:

- Impact of products under re-evaluation i.e. neonicotinoids, linuron, ebdc's, pyrethroids, etc.
- Resistance management issues
- New invasive species
- Inconsistent registrant support for minor use requests
